The Reason Why;

When I attempt to explain why I fly fish, either to friends or strangers alike. I am amazed at the response when after going into great detail, the effort involved in the actual netting of a fish via the fly, that the first comment I receive is "that sounds like a lot of work for a fish". After a few additional comments I usually grin and acknowledge the effort but no words can explain the tribulations that one receives on a personal level landing that fish. Knowing the memory of that effort or in some specific cases, that journey will last days or better yet, a lifetime.

All of us are involved in fly fishing for personal reasons. For some it is the thrill of matching a hatch and landing a trophy trout. For others it is the time to reconnect with friends, spending time getting reacquainted after a long week at work. And for me personally it is the escape to the river, far away from others, pushing away from the stress of everyday life. SWMTU 2008 Conservation Review

The Schrems chapter had an extremely productive year of conservation work completing eight work day projects on two rivers in western Michigan. Your chapter is making an impact improving the habitat and water quality on local streams. The year started back on April 5th when the Grand Valley Soil and Water Conservation group came to Tyler Creek to roll some rocks and in the high spring flows they placed the rocks along the banks to protect against erosion. The volunteers were organized by student Jessie Lincoln and were joined by SWMTU members Rich Steketee and Josh Zuiderveen.



On May 3rd, our chapter was joined by volunteers from the Oak Brook chapter from Illinois as they brought their usual enthusiasm for stream work from the Windy City. The Oak Brook chapter has partnered with several Michigan TU chapters for stream restoration work and we are fortunate that they have chosen to work with us. The day got off to a great start as we arrived and found a fisherman catching 15-17" trout out of one of the holes we had created in the previous year. It is great to see our work having and impact.



The chapter conducted additional work days on Tyler Creek in June, July and August when we were also joined by TU members from the Kalamazoo Valley chapter, and the Lansing - Bob Perrin chapter. I want to especially thank Ed Hoover and Jim Bedford for their support throughout the Tyler Creek project. The Tyler Creek Golf Course also provided significant support throughout the year with donated equipment and labor. Samuel Pyle, Trent Green, and Dan from the golf course were extremely gracious hosts for all the work days conducted there this year. All of these Tyler Creek projects this year involved either rock or log structures that we created in order to improve the habitat of the stream. Based on the results we are seeing from our work in 2007, we are seeing some noticeable improvements.

On August 23rd, the chapter shifted its work over to the Pigeon River in Ottawa County along a stretch in Hemlock Park. Seventeen volunteers removed trash from the stream as well as cleaned out a couple of log jams that were creating stagnant water. We also

installed rock and wood structures to improve the habitat. The GVSU Soil and Water Conservation Group also came in a few weeks later to continue our work a little further downstream. The Pigeon is home to brown trout and does get a run of fish from Lake Michigan. The project was made feasible by a generous donation from John McCarthy.

I also want to recognize a couple of SWMTU members Jerry Hetric and George Buursma who were frequent volunteers at our projects this year, your support was greatly appreciated.

We have one last project in the works for 2008 back on Tyler Creek. As I write this, we are awaiting for the close of the public comment period on our permit application to create a couple of wetlands along Tyler Creek. The first wetland will divert the flow from a drain tile that drains a farm field into Tyler Creek into a wetland where the runoff will be filtered and the water will be able to infiltrate into the groundwater rather than just increasing runoff. The second wetland will isolate an old mill dump from Tyler Creek. Both of these wetlands should act to improve the water quality of the stream and serve to recharge local groundwater. We hope to complete more of these types of projects in the future.



Finally during the year, the chapter was involved in investigating local dams for potential removal in the future. We are starting to work with the Muskegon River Watershed Assembly in this effort. The chapter also hosted a tour for TU on the Rogue River and we are working with national to put together a plan and funding to make the Rogue a "Home River" sometime during 2009. I hope that you will make plans to join us on one of our projects in 2009.


